

There were about 10 faculty from SHUTCM who provided lectures for this program, mainly in Chinese medicine theory, research in herbal medicine and acupuncture, and modern development in Chinese medicine.

	<p>Xueyong Shen, is Professor and Former Dean of School of Acupuncture and Tuina at SHUTCM. He serves as the director of WHO International Training Center for Acupuncture and Moxibustion, Director of Acupuncture Education Committee under the Chinese Association of Acupuncture and Moxibustion. He is also the vice chairman of Shanghai Association of Acupuncture and Moxibustion as well as deputy Editor-in-Chief of Shanghai Journal of Acupuncture and Moxibustion. He has been engaged in the research on biophysical characteristics of meridians over the past four decades. Prof. Shen has authored 5 textbooks and published 33 academic papers in high-profile journals.</p>
	<p>Yuandong Shen, MD, is Chair of WHO ISO/TC 249, Director of Institute of TCM International Standardization of Shanghai University of Traditional Chinese Medicine, director of Shanghai Association of Traditional Chinese Medicine Physicians, and director of Shanghai Technical Committee of TCM Standardization. Professor Shen has been involved in hospital management for over thirty years. He presided over the compiling of 12th five-year plan of TCM development for Shanghai Municipal government. He started focus on ISO quality system management since 2001. With current role of being the Chair of ISO/TC 249, he has worked with all of his effort to promote TCM standardization for more than 10 years and received much recognition in the overall management of the committee. Through his efforts, 5 working groups, 2 joint working groups and 3 liaison organizations have been established. Moreover, 28 international standards have been published and 46 are under development. Professor Shen graduated from SHUTCM in 1975 and finished his study in the department of Hospital Management at China-Europe International Business School in 2002. He was vice director of Shanghai Municipal Health Bureau and director of Shanghai Municipal Office of Chinese Medicine Development.</p>
	<p>Hailei Zhao, PhD, is Associate Professor and Associate Dean of International Education College, Shanghai University of Traditional Chinese Medicine. He is currently the Director of the Confucius Institute at Augusta University, USA. He has been engaged in TCM education and clinical service for 20 years. His research focuses on the prevention and treatment of cancers, especially the digestive system cancers by using Chinese herbal formula; TCM education administration and clinical training management. Dr. Zhao has authored two textbooks and joined the translation panel in one book. He was awarded first prize in teaching achievement by Shanghai University of Traditional Chinese Medicine. He received his bachelor of Medicine, MS, and PhD in integrative medicine from Shanghai University of Traditional Chinese Medicine. He also earned his Master of Public Administration from National University of Singapore in 2011.</p>

Two Professors from Fudan University School of Public Health also participated in teaching for the program. Professor Jiayan Huang, PhD, Chair of Department of Hospital Management Professor Yinyao Chen is Associate Dean of International Collaboration. Both of them had visiting scholar experience at UCLA School of Public Health.



Yinyao Chen, PhD, is Professor of Health Services and Associate Dean of international collaboration at the School of Public Health, Fudan University. He serves as Director of the Key Lab of Health Technology Assessment (National Health Commission), and Director of WHO Collaborating Center for Health Technology Assessment and Management at Fudan University. His academic interests focus on health technology assessment, health policy, health economics, and hospital management. He was a PI of several projects funded by the World Health Organization, World Bank, China Medical Board, Ministry of Health, Ministry of Science and Technology, National Natural Science Foundation of China, and provincial health authorities. He received both his Bachelor of Medicine and Master of Public Health from Shanghai Medical University and earned his Ph.D. in Management from Fudan University in 2006. He took part in a visiting scholar program at the University of California, Los Angeles, 1999-2001.



Jiayang Huang, PhD, is Professor of Health Services at School of Public Health, Fudan University, and Chair of Department of Hospital Management. Her field of interest includes health policy analysis, program evaluation, health technology assessment and global health. In the past 5 years, she has been engaged in global health research, especially with countries on the Belt & Road Initiatives. She also conducted 2 sub-projects of China-UK Global Health Support Program as project manager and core members. Professor Huang, as first author, has published 3 monographs and more than 80 academic articles in international and Chinese top journals. She received her Bachelor of Medicine at Shanghai Medical University in 1999, and PhD in Management at Fudan University in 2005. In the year of 2011, she studied public health and policy at UCLA School of Public Health as a visiting scholar.
